Americans going for the Saints

Raleigh, N.C. – In a time of increasing political polarization, even the Super Bowl is dividing Americans along party lines.

A new Public Policy Polling national survey finds that 32% of voters in the country are rooting for the New Orleans Saints on Sunday, compared to 22% who prefer the Indianapolis Colts.

Democrats strongly prefer the Saints, by a 36-21 margin. But Republicans are narrowly going for the Colts, 26-25. Independents lean toward the Saints as well, 33-20.

Perhaps the most interesting thing about the numbers is that a 46% plurality of voters don't care who wins on Sunday. For many the Super Bowl is more about the aura of the event than really caring who comes out on top.

There is less division along racial lines with whites, blacks, and Hispanics all pulling for the team from New Orleans. African Americans are strongest in their support, 38-23, with whites and Hispanics putting up almost identical numbers at 31-22 and 31-23 respectively.

"There may not be the same kind of partisan gap on the Super Bowl that there is for Barack Obama's approval ratings but even when it comes to football there are two Americas," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "You're much more likely to be rooting for the Saints this weekend if you're a Democrat."

PPP surveyed 584 registered voters from January 29th to 31st. The margin of error is +/-4.1%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
